2. Innovation and Recognition:

- b. The PHS faculty came together to host our first live term assembly on November 4th. There were more than 50 attendees at the live event as the fall extracurricular activities, AP test takers from the spring, honor roll, and perfect attendance students were recognized.

- d. In Term 1, there were eight students with perfect attendance. In this flexible definition of attendance, we considered any student who was physically present

- for their cohort, checked in to classes on the off days with fidelity, and if absent, had a valid excused absence.
- e. The PHS High Honor Roll, which are students earning a 3.5 4.0 for the Term, consisted of seven freshmen, 15 sophomores, six juniors, and 18 seniors.
- f. The PHS Honor Roll, which are students earning 3.00 3.49 for the Term, consisted of seven freshmen, eight sophomores, 10 juniors, and eight seniors.
