Current Schedule

- Currently we have two full day sessions per week
 - Monday/Thursday group Currently 16 children
 - Tuesday/Friday group Currently 10 children
- Developmentally appropriate day
- Offer Breakfast and Lunch and Snack to all kids
- Morning Morning meeting, pre-math skills, large muscle and brain development work, pre-reading and writing work, and fine motor skills
- Afternoon Recess, stories, rest, choice and small group work, Library/Guidance, snack and review/recap of the day

Academic goals

- <u>Pre-Math Skills</u>
 - Count to 30
 - Recognize numbers to 10
 - Makes sets to 10
 - Name 9 basic colors
 - Name 6 shapes
- <u>Reading Readiness Skills</u>
 - Introduce the letters and the sounds that they make
 - Shared reading activities and print awareness


- <u>Pre-Writing Skills</u>
 - $\circ \quad \text{Writing letters and numbers} \\$
 - Free drawing and practice with writing tools
 - Writing their name

PLC Focus

• Everything we do in 4K contributes to employability

Employability Skills

- Collaboration with 4K-3 during vertical
 - Aligning ELA, Math, etc.



Horizontal PLC - Name writing



- Students are assessed in the Fall
- We try to meet the kids where they are at and build on what they have already learned
- We use many different presentations
 - \circ Tracing dotted letters
 - Writing on plain paper, back of projects
 - Writing with pencils, crayons, markers, etc.
 - Practice on white boards
 - Use Playdough to write their name
 - Spell it with magnetic letters
 - Study names in Our Name Books
- Always encouraging them to say the letters as they write them to reinforce

Support and Extend

- Some students are not at benchmark
 - May developmentally not be ready
 - We work on more fine motor skills
 - Pencil grip
 - Work to build interest
- Some students do meet the benchmark
 - Challenge these students with learning to write their last name too
 - May be ready to start writing simple words
- Ability levels are different, but we focus on seeing improvement in all students
