Safety and Security

Fire Alarm System Upgrades

- The fire alarm upgrades are approximately 80% finished on campus. They will be finishing the work over Christmas Break.

Digital Mapping Grant

- We received notice that our grant application was approved and will be scheduling the Digital Mapping in the next few months.

Comprehensive Security Audit

- Members of Administration and Chief Duerr met with two Environmental, Health, and Safety Consultants today as part of a Safety and Security Audit. They will be completing a a report

Speak Up Speak Out

- Speak Up Speak Out. It is a 24 hour confidential tip line that is manned by the state in which students, parents, and community members can reach out in regards to concerning behaviors within school communities.

- PSD Staff did a SWOT Analysis during our professional learning day last week.

Strengths—Small class sizes, quality educators/caring staff, calendar start and stop dates(Prior to Memorial Day) , Spring Break, CTE Program, Dual Credit, internships/apprenticeships

Weaknesses— Too many initiatives, lack of subs, teacher compensation locally, student discipline, micromanagement by Admin

Opportunities—Ways to retain/attract staff, Co-ops for athletics, Fitness Center hours/access, students being able to participate in multiple activities simultaneously.

Threats—Extra “busy work”, accountability for students and student behavior, sub shortage, teacher burnout(too many committees/meetings)

- A State Grant, administered through CESA allowed us to double our current School Nurse hours from 11 to 22 per week at no cost to the district.
- District Leadership met with a Data Specialist from CESA 5 last week to break down our State Report Card. The public release is scheduled for November, 15th. We will have presentation prepared for the Board at the December meeting.

Panther Community Fitness Center Proposed Changes

- Membership has gone from the 85 memberships 4 years ago to 38 currently.
- Met with stakeholders, including members, fitness center coordinators, administration, and athletic department representatives

Recommendations:

1. Significantly expanding hours of access
2. Assignment of FOBs to members
3. Periodic training sessions for members
4. Access for retired PSD Employees
5. Full access for PSD Coaches/Advisors not just during their coaching season
6. Raising the fee (Expanded access, training, equipment maintenance and upgrades)
Currently \$108 for a membership
7. Membership Drive with the enhanced access/resources via social media, School Messenger, etc.
8. Changes would be implemented by January 1st, 2023
