- 3. Certification for applicable grade levels.
- 4. Three years of successful classroom teaching experience at the elementary level.
- 5. Demonstrates an understanding and use of equitable and culturally responsive practices.
- 6. Excellent interpersonal and communication skills.
- 7. Ability to apply instructional strategies on differentiation.
- 8. Strong organizational skills.
- 9. Ability to multi-task needs.
- 10. Knowledge of collaboration practices, team-teaching practices, and special education.
- 11. Ability to collect data and make course placement recommendations for students.
- 12. Ability to build and maintain effective relationships with school administrators, staff, students, and families.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Responsible for supporting student achievement in mathematics, focusing on Tier II and III instruction.
- 2. Provide individual or small-group instruction ensuring high levels of mathematical understanding and implementation with all identified students.
- 3. Monitors, reports, and communicates student progress and performance to grade-level teams and administration.
- 4. Provides high quality instruction to individual students and small groups.
- 5. Uses data to provide instruction to students and to bring their skills to grade-level.
- 6. Collaborates with teachers, administration, and families to help identify best practices for individual and small groups of students.
- 7. Uses identified research-based interventions that focus specifically on individual student needs.
- 8. Maintains data-based documentation of continuous monitoring of student performance and progress.
- 9. Provides data to school teams and participates in decisions about student progress.
- 10. Assists with identifying students for placement in an intervention group.
- 11. Participates in meetings with teachers, administration, and families to discuss student placement and progress.
- 12. Provides diagnostic assessments for students as needed.
- 13. Provides input for program development.
- 14. Supports implementation of assessment tools and data management systems.
- 15. Attends the appropriate trainings to improve knowledge and skills.
- 16. Provide staff development opportunities.
- 17. Performs other related duties as assigned.
