STUDENT CONDUCT

443

Student in the School District shall be expected to act in such fashion that their behavior will reflect favorably on the individual student and on the school, show consideration for the fellow students, and create a harmonious school atmosphere. To accomplish this, each student must recognize individual responsibilities and obligations and discharge them in accordance with school regulations.

Students are expected to abide by the code of conduct and behavior as outlined in the student handbook, and/or as stated in the rules and regulations established by Building Principals for each school.

All employees shall share responsibility for supervising the behavior of students and for seeing that they meet the standards of conduct established by the Building Principal. In enforcing rules for student conduct, staff members shall place particular emphasis upon educating students in the ability to control themselves.

The School District shall not discriminate in standards and rules of behavior, including student harassment, on the basis of sex, race, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, or physical, mental, emotional, or learning disability.
