- 1. Student and Staff Learning:
 - a. PHS is committed to ensuring all students have access to the curriculum every day, for all classes - Google classrooms - all teachers, all classes - SY 19-20
 - b. Peer to Peer Coaching and Mentoring for SY 19 20 will be an exciting way to experience professional development for our teachers; k - 12 district teachers will support one another using the DPI recommended New Teacher Center Peer Coaching model

- 2. Innovation and Recognition:
 - PHS will be transforming the backstage room behind the stage into a multipurpose fitness room. This room will have a mirrored wall and be used for activities such as Yoga, group fitness, boxing, dance / cheer, etc.

- 3. Looking Ahead:
 - a. The room behind the gym, at the end of the locker rooms hall, now called the "Sun Room", may be getting a camera and transforming into another cafe eating space. The dismantling of our HS computer lab will allow us to repurpose the countertops to create hi-bar seating for students during lunch, or a swing space for learning and student collaboration.
 - b. The Renaissance Learning program, STAR Math and Reading, as well as the curriculum pieces, Accelerated Math, is being given to students prior to year's

end. This will allow us to begin collecting data on students to best determine where they are on their learning journey, as well as any gaps in learning. The end-of-year assessments are being given to all 8th, 9th and 10th graders.
